
MISSION:

GRANT GUIDELINES

Based on the Foundation Values the following key criteria will be applied in determining funding:



Geography: Focus on the oral and overall health of lowans. At times, an investment in a national learning collaborative or project may have an impact on lowans, so this funding may be considered.



Equity Focus: With a focus on marginalized lowans, describe in detail what conditions exist impacting equity and provide data that supports the identified area of need.



Systems Approach: Impact the oral and/or overall health system and shift the conditions that currently exist at the local and/or statewide level. Projects will identify how lessons learned can impact the oral and/or overall health system.



Leadership: Be a catalyst for change, a builder and an innovator.



Partners (Shared Approach): Engage with other partners and organizations to achieve identified goals. Adopt a shared approach to success.



Success: Measure success and impact while aligning with the Foundation dashboard and goals.



Policy: Identify and address opportunities for policy analysis and public education.



In general, the Foundation does not fund:

- + Direct dental services
- + Grants to individuals
- Projects that do not have a direct or indirect impact on health and smiles of lowans
- + Political campaigns and lobbying
- + Religious purposes
- + Sponsorships
- + Ongoing or emergency food assistance requests
- + Toothbrush donation requests without strong oral health education component

FUNDING PORTFOLIO

The Foundation will invest in projects that promote health and smiles for all lowans through our core initiatives, **oral health**, **oral and overall health integration**, and **overall health** all through an equity lens. Funds are invested in programs that align with one the following three strategic areas of focus: **education and advocacy, access and prevention, and policy and research**.

Funds will be distributed through the grant programs outlined below.

SMILE GRANTS:

\$5,000 or less, to support projects that are primarily educational in nature such as providing educational materials or supplies related to our core initiatives. Applications open in January and are accepted on an ongoing basis until all funds are allocated.

COMMUNITY OF HEALTH GRANTS:

\$5,001 - \$50,000, due March 1 and September 1

Partnering with others who share our mission and values is necessary to strengthen and transform the health and smiles of all lowans. The Foundation will make investments in projects that advance our core initiatives, align within the three strategic areas of focus.

SYSTEM AND CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS:

Over \$50,000, letters of interest (LOI) due March 1 and September 1.

Large grants to support infrastructure and major system change efforts related to the Foundation's core initiatives. Following a review by a grant committee, proposals approved to move forward will be invited to present to the Delta Dental of Iowa Foundation Board of Directors.

COMMUNITY OF HEALTH GRANTS

Our commitment to health equity through Community of Health grant investments is rooted in the belief that all lowans deserve equitable access to health care. We take a comprehensive approach to addressing health disparities among individuals who are disproportionately impacted in our state.

MARGINALIZED POPULATIONS:

Strengthen dental, vision, and mental/emotional health access to care for refugees, immigrants, people with disabilities, BIPOC (black, indigenous, and people of color), people living in rural communities and LGBTQ+ populations. We aim to support initiatives that promote culturally appropriate oral and overall health education, ensuring that knowledge is accessible and relevant.

Our 2023 - 2025 health equity plan focuses on collaboration with our partners to focus on marginalized populations in strengthening and transforming the following critical issues:



DENTAL WORKFORCE

+ Strengthen the capacity of the dental workforce through representation, innovation and education. In addition, support initiatives that educate and raise awareness about dental careers in lowa.

OO VISION HEALTH

- + Identify and build awareness of critical public health challenges as they relate to vision health.
- + Develop strategies and opportunities that address vision health disparities through systemic solutions, ultimately striving for all lowans to have equal access to comprehensive vision care.

MENTAL/EMOTIONAL HEALTH

- + Identify and build awareness of stigma while supporting initiatives that address mental/ emotional health through systemic solutions, education, and outreach.
- + A special focus will be to create an open and supportive culture within dental professions, with an emphasis on improving mental health and well-being.



VETERANS' ORAL HEALTH

+ Identify and eliminate challenges veterans face to access oral health care to ensure healthier outcomes.
