
Evaluation Framework

Iowans for Oral Health

- Proactive education about community water fluoridation (CWF)
- Engage coalition members in responding to threats to CWF
- Public health professionals, dentists, Hispanic/Latino focus

388 educational contacts made to 5,800+ individuals throughout lowa

Grantee Spotlight:

Dentist By 1[™] — Pottawattamie County Pilot

- 82% of those surveyed demonstrated knowledge of importance of age 1 dental visit
- The percentage of children who had a dental visit, ages 0-5 and enrolled in Medicaid, increased from 36% to 49% throughout the three-year campaign

Grantee Spotlight:

I-Smile™ Silver

- Streamline referral process to dentist
- Limited dental codes approved for use and reimbursement for public health agencies to serve older adults
- Protocol for use of silver diamine fluoride finalized

Since 2011, counties with dental public health initiatives specifically targeting older adults have expanded from 9 to 42 counties

During the 2016-2017 school year, I-Smile @ School™ provided:

- 18,841 students with oral screenings
- **52,741** sealants for 10,548 students

90.2% of Iowans have access to a community fluoridated water system

- The Foundation has supported several projects that contributed to systemwide knowledge about emerging topics in Oral Health.
- University of Iowa College of Dentistry Office of Education & Training expects to conduct an evaluation to see if oral health care training for direct care workers in nursing homes has an impact on patient-specific outcomes.

Grantee Spotlight:

Iowa CareGivers

- Incorporated existing oral health assessment tools into training
- High workforce turnover adjust class length while keeping hands-on nature for program quality
- Employ ways to reinforce learning long-term (app., texting, email)

Common theme among grantees:

Program standardization to ensure quality & Consistency for growth

Sustain



- Success of IPHA/IDPH fluoridation partnership influenced development and funding of a water fluoridation coordinator
- Oral health coalition established due to Dentist By 1 campaign in Pottawattamie County
 - Will continue to meet after grant period and focus on additional oral health initiatives (e.g., fluoride varnish)
- IDPH cultivates relationship with Iowa Medicaid Enterprise to ensure contractors are able to bill for sealant services
