


Delta Dental of Iowa Foundation 2020 Strategic Vision

Through the Delta Dental of Iowa Foundation and Public Benefit Program, Delta Dental invests in projects that improve our communities and support oral and overall health initiatives.

Pottawattamie & Southwest Iowa Counties


An early visit to the dentist sets the foundation for a lifetime of good oral health. The Foundation is proud to support Dentist By 1 to help educate parents and caregivers about the benefits of taking children to the dentist by the age of one. Delta Dental began the Dentist By 1 campaign and project funding in Pottawattamie and other surrounding southwest lowa counties beginning in 2015.





The Foundation invested more than \$163,000 in Pottawattamie and surrounding southwest Iowa counties in the Dentist By 1 public education campaign. A partnership with FAMILY, Inc. and local community organizations enables effective grassroots communication and outreach efforts.

The percentage of children, ages 0-5, who had a dental service in Pottawattamie county has increased throughout the three-year campaign.

School-Based Dental Sealants

The Foundation provided \$200,000 in 2017 and continued its collaboration with the Iowa Department of Public Health as part of a long-term partnership to continue expansion of their school-based dental sealant programs in Iowa. Since 2013, \$871,800 has been invested to help expand program services from 27 to 93 counties throughout Iowa. Four counties are covered by other school-based dental sealant programs, and two counties remain.



Oral Health Prevention and Education in all 99 Iowa Counties

To help establish lowans' oral health habits, the Foundation donated more than 375,000 toothbrushes and provided educational materials to Iowa schools, clinics, hospitals, I-Smile™ 2016: coordinators and Head Starts in all 99 Iowa counties.

RETHINK

"Rethink You Drink" aims to get more kids drinking water throughout the day to support their oral and overall health. The Foundation provided \$230,000 to 54 schools across lowa. The selected schools received a new water fountain/bottle filling station and reusable water bottles, bookmarks and toothbrushes for students and staff. In addition, more than 40 schools applied and received \$500 for an educational campaign to encourage students to drink more water.

Statewide Fluoridation

Community water fluoridation is a safe and healthy way to effectively prevent tooth decay.

In 2017, the Foundation provided \$24.999 to the Iowa Public Health Association to support lowans for Oral Health, a statewide coalition focused on maintaining community water fluoridation as a public health benefit for lowans.


The coalition provides support, fluoridation educational resources and access to funding opportunities.



The City of Shenandoah received \$25,000 to support continued fluoridation efforts in their community.





Since 2011, counties with dental public health initiatives specifically targeting older adults have expanded from 9 to 42 counties.



The Foundation supports initiatives of the **Lifelong Smiles Coalition**.

\$1.2 million provided in grant funds since 2013 to advance oral health for older lowans.

\$203,455 was funded in 2017 to the Iowa Department of Public Health's I-Smile™ Silver - a community-based pilot project in Des Moines, Lee, Scott and Van Buren counties that connect older adults to oral health education and care.

\$64,460 was awarded in 2017 to the Iowa Department of Public Health and The University of Iowa College of Dentistry and Dental Clinics to support oral health research of older Iowans. This research complements the ongoing Lifelong Smiles Coalition projects.


FIND and Delta Dental of Iowa Loan Repayment Programs

Dentists in these programs practice in one of lowa's designated dental high priority areas and allocate at least 35 percent of patient services to vulnerable populations including uninsured and underinsured lowans.

Awarded \$80,000 each to Dr. Kaci Vela of Mount Pleasant and Dr. Jarod Johnson of Muscatine for the repayment of dental education debt through the FIND program. In addition, Dr. Cassie Berens received \$50,000 through the Delta Dental of Iowa Loan Repayment Program.










Since 2002, 35 private-practice dentists have participated in the Loan Repayment and FIND programs to provide 139,000 patient visits and more than 418,000 dental services to underserved lowans.




Community Events and **Engagement**
